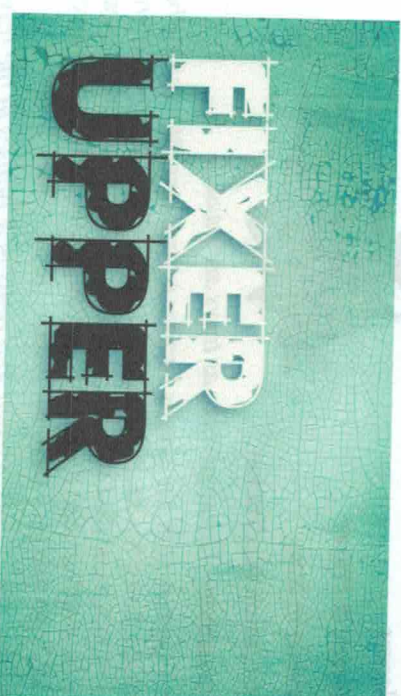

Fixer Upper

Remodeling our relationship with Jesus
Colossians 3:1-4

We've talked about marriage and parenting so far. Today, let's talk about our relationship with Jesus. Today, we are fixing our eyes on Jesus our King.

We aren't as we want to be. We are a work in progress. That's alright! We have a Christian identity crisis as well as Christian Attention Deficit Disorder. What's the fix?

Today is not about guilt. Today is about fully recognizing that we are a work in progress.

"I know it hurts to be torn up. I am often choked on the litter left by my own remodeling. I know what it's like to settle (by the grave act of a strong will) into the despair of believing that you are wasted space...I know the pain of wanting to be changed and yet being distrustful of change, of wanting to be worked on, but being suspicious of the intentions of the workers. But here is some good news: He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

"However messy it may be now, however confusing and scary it appears, however endless the task may seem, we will some day be glorious, beautiful, alive! There is much tearing out to do--a lot to give up. No thin coat of new paint, no shallow, petty piety will do. It's not good enough to cover up imperfection, it must be corrected. Art, beauty, function--these things take time. They may take 'til the day of Christ Jesus."

For now, my simple challenge is for each of us to consider and remember where Jesus is seated, at the right hand of God.

Let's fix our eyes on Jesus as he fixes our ailing hearts.

Fixer Upper

Blueprints week 3 - Humility

As we continue the Fixer Upper Series, we've been making our way through the list of our new clothing in Christ from Colossians 3:12

Monday – Matthew 23:1-12 – what are the attitudes of the Pharisees that aren't humble? What are similar attitudes that we share with them? How does our pride get in the way of becoming more like Jesus? See also Luke 14:7-11

Tuesday - Luke 18:9-14 – this parable is all about humility that leads to God's mercy. We really don't need God's mercy if we come before him in pride. "Have mercy on me, a sinner" is the cry of a remorseful person, understanding of their need for God. They are those who are justified by God. The humbled are lifted up.

Wednesday – Luke 18:15-17 – Come to the Lord like a little child. He welcomes them, and encourages us all to come to him in child likeness. Our culture is quite a bit different than the 1st century. We idolize kids and put them in high standing. But, children were often ostracized and forgotten in the 1st century. Not worthy of coming before the king, hence the reason why the disciples shooed them away. But Jesus wants us to know that they belong, and we come to him in the same way. Mark 9:33-37

Thursday - Matthew 20:25-27 – The greatest among us is the servant. Think about that for a while. The affirmation and accolades that often occupy our motivation have no real place in the kingdom. The greatest are not the MVP's and those holding the trophies. The greatest are those who serve without looking for affirmation and accolade. This is a difficult lesson, but one necessary if we will understand the way of King Jesus.

Friday – Think about Philipians 2:1-11 today. What does Paul want us to learn about Jesus and model in our life?
